

Instructor Program Syllabus

Description:

The Cosmetology Instructor program meets the minimum requirement by the State of Texas. The Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation has approved IHeart Lash Academy and its curriculum. The Scheduled completion time for this 500 /750 Hours clock hour course is 6 months for FULL TIME and 8 months for PART TIME. Students will attend three phases for this program. Phase I will cover basic teaching skills for career education instructors , Phase II will cover Basic teaching skills for career education in the beauty and wellness disciplines and Phase III will cover Professional development for career education instructors. This is a Hybrid Course than can be completed online and in person, the theory portion will be online while the practical portion will be completed in the academy

Objective:

Upon completion of the cosmetology instructor requirements , the graduate will be able to

- 1. Display personal integrity with self confidence and a positive attitude.
- 2. Display effective communication skills, visual poise and proper grooming.
- 3. Display effective employer employee skills
- 4. Perform all eyelash extension skills at or above a basic level
- 5. Apply learned theory, technical information and related matter to assure sound judgements, decisions and procedures

To continue to grow as an Instructor , the graduate should to continue to learn new and current information related to skills, trends, and methods for career enhancement in cosmetology and related fields.

Tuition : The tuition cost for this program is **\$7500.00** this does include your full lash kit. This does not include uniform or textbook. Financial Aid is not available at this time.

Hybrid/Online Learning: Hybrid Online learning is available for Texas Students only, students will complete half of this course (theory) online and the other half (practical) face to face.

Instruction Methods :

IHeart Lash Academy curriculum is used in the program. Specific tasks necessary for state board preparation and entry level job skills are taught in sequential steps. Clinic equipment,

Education methods used include lecture, demonstration. Textbook study, hands on practice, audio visuals, guest speakers, field trips not exceed 30 hours, projects and activities.

Grading :

Students must maintain a minimum grade of average of 75% to be making satisfactory academic progress. Students are graded on theory, practical and clinic work. All grades will be on a 100 point scale. Written tests are generally given on Friday after each textbook chapter. In addition to the test, the workbook and assignment are due on the Friday after each textbook chapter. IF the student does not pass a chapter test , the score will be recored; but the student has one opportunity to re-test. If the re- test score is higher , it will replace the first score. A 10 point penalty applies on each assignment for each day work is late. Two comprehensive written exams are given at the completion of all chapter tests; the minimum passing score on a written final is 80%.
